Rhetorical Devices for Speeches Alliteration repetition of initial consonant sound The initial consonant sound is usually repeated in two neighbouring words (sometimes also in words that are not next to each other) Alliteration draws attention to the phrase and is often used for emphasis

Persuasive Strategies and Rhetorical Devices There are three types of persuasive strategies; a good argument will use the combination of all 3 Logos - logical argument; an appeal to logic or reason Ethos - appeals based on the reliability, credibility, or expertise of the writer Pathos - appeals to the audience's needs, values or emotions A rhetorical device is a technique of using

The VERY Short List of Lincoln's Literary/Rhetorical Devices

Words that create mental pictures and often appeal to the senses (sight, sound, taste, smell) R : Inclusive language The emphasis on common beliefs, actions, and emotions to invoke and invite all members (including enemies) of an audience to consider the author's message L : Metaphor Makes a comparison without using "like" or "as"

Poets often use structural elements, such as meter and rhyme scheme, to help create a particular mood Meter is simply the repetition of a rhythmic unit, and rhyme is the use of words (most often at the end of lines) that share a similar sound Reread the first eight lines of the poem, and write down the words that rhyme How many

Enjambment is often used by a poet as one means to bind a poem together It also has the benefit of making a pause before completion of a thought English all in the valley of death road the six hundred (Tennyson) HENDIADYS-the expression of an idea using two nouns joined with "and" instead of a noun and an adjective
