Up to midnight on 617 June 1944, 75,215 (British and Canadians) + 57,600 (American) in all 132,815 men were landed from ships and craft, suffering 3,000 British casualties (4 per cent, compared with 165 per cent casualties among the 7,900 British troops landed by air)
