In the bull Romanus Pontifex issued in 1455, Pope Nicholas V settled a dispute over land in Africa between Portugal and Spain by granting Portugal exclusive rights to conquer and trade in an extensive southern region of the continent¹² The goal of universal salvation, the bull opines, "will more certainly come to pass if we bestow
